

Our Stewardship officers have made some transitions. For the past year, Doug McCann has been transitioning out of the Treasurer role. Doug will continue to serve as chair of the Welcome Team and be active in other ways, but the Treasurer position will now be carried out by Brad Delozier and Shannon Brozovich. In addition, Sue Edwards has enlisted Laura Luksik to assist in the duties of Financial Secretary.

We are also grateful to the Ministry Teams for implementing specific aspects of our vision. The Outreach Team consists of Jeff Kahl, Emma McCann, and Laura Luksik...and we often consult with people outside the church to get their valuable perspectives on how to reach the broader community. The Welcome Team includes Doug McCann, Dan Seel, Angela Fackler, Lori Borgen, and Bea Kohler. The Worship and Tech Team includes Ken Edwards, Matt McCann, Augie Fackler, Ed Borgen, Caleb Seel, Nick Williams, Sue Edwards, and Mia Moore. Finally, our Sunday School program has been led by Cherith Kahl (older elementary), Emma McCann (younger elementary), Jeff Kahl (youth), and Augie Fackler (adults). Thanks to all of you for using your gifts and passions to serve God!

Pastor Jeff would like to thank his two most important "partners in ministry" – Cherith and Cyrus. Both of them contribute to the ministry of Stoneridge through their positive and friendly presence, their spiritual gifts, their prayers, and their loving support of Jeff. And Emma is grateful to Matt, Patrick and Marta for their love and support in the midst of her job transition and their first-time house purchase.

In the pages that follow, you can read specific ministry initiatives from the individual Ministry Team chairs, but here are some of the varied ways that Pastor Jeff individually uses his gifts and talents to bring Gospel ministry to our congregation and the wider community:

PROVIDE WORSHIP LEADERSHIP

- Work with worship and tech team to plan all aspects of Sunday worship service.
- Research, plan, and deliver a weekly sermon based on a careful reading of Scripture with practical application to our Christian life.
- Monthly administration of the sacrament of Holy Communion, and administration of the sacrament of Baptism upon request.
- Officiate funeral services and other special times of worship when needed.
- Assist with musical leadership when needed.

CONGREGATIONAL MINISTRY

- Pastoral care through home/hospital visits, individual mentoring or spiritual direction when needed.
- > Teaching Ministry: Youth Sunday school and In-Depth Bible Studies.
- Maintain regular office hours for drop-ins.
- Attend and participate in church fellowship events, service projects, and outreach programs.
- Keep the congregation informed through weekly emails and social media posts.

ADMINISTRATIVE LEADERSHIP

- Regular meetings with church chair, and meetings with other Leadership Team or Financial Officers as needed.
- Work collaboratively with Leadership and Ministry Teams to cast a vision for the church and implement specific actions or programs.
- Set quarterly administrative goals and timelines for myself for personal accountability and greater efficiency of effort.
- Developing greater competence in financial/budget knowledge, church database software, and other organizational aspects of the church. Attended several online seminars addressing administrative issues for churches.

COMMUNITY MINISTRY

- ➤ I continue to serve as pastoral presence for the Cancer Support Group and Ryan's Wings Non-profit.
- ➤ I continue to serve as a tutor (and occasionally guest preacher) to homeschooled children at the Blackburn Study Center.
- In addition to building relationships with people at the Shaler Township Offices, Shaler Library, Soccer Shots, and Burchfield Elementary, I am currently developing strategic partnerships with two other community groups that will hopefully enhance our community ministry here at Stoneridge.
- ➤ I continue to serve as a member of the Shaler-Etna-Hampton Ministerium, as well as board member of the Bread of Life Food Pantry in Etna.

DENOMINATIONAL MINISTRY

- ➤ I participate in monthly gatherings of Covenant clergy at Austintown Community Church near Youngstown, OH.
- ➤ I maintain regular contact with Rev. Garth McGrath, conference superintendent for the Great Lakes Conference.
- ➤ I attended the GLC Ministerium Meeting this past April, and participated in clergy enrichment seminars this past year: "Improving Online Ministry," "Personal Evangelism," and "The Pastor's Spiritual Health."

PERSONAL SELF-CARE

- > This past year, I met monthly with a spiritual director to address my own spiritual needs and goals for personal growth.
- > I maintain good habits of study, prayer, and personal worship.
- > I exercise 5 times a week and (usually) maintain a healthy diet.
- > I guard my time with Cherith, Cyrus, extended family, and friends outside the church.

STONERIDGE CHURCH OUTREACH TEAM ANNUAL REPORT 2020-2021

The Outreach Team attempted to continue to **build strong partnerships** with other community organizations, as well as **host events** that could increase the church's visibility, promote a positive image of the church, and allow us to build relationships with people in the community. We also used some of the designated funds from the property sale to acquire a bounce houses, which we can use for various outreach activities like Adventure Week. Here are some specifics:

BUILD STRONG PARTNERSHIPS

- Continued to provide our building for outside groups such as Soccer Shots, Dance Showcase, and Ryan's Wings. Pastor Jeff has attended Ryan's Wings yearly Bike Run and provided prayer and blessing for the bikers.
- We hosted five Red Cross Blood Drives at the church in October, December, February, April, and July. In April we held a bake sale to raise money for the youth "UNITE" fund.
- We continued to partner with Shaler Library, Ruby's Angels, and Shaler Villa Fire Department in promoting events.
- Beginning this Fall, we will also be hosting a Girl Scout Troop, and in gratitude they have offered to do service projects around the church.

HOST OUTREACH EVENTS

- Drive-Thru Fall Festival September 2020 (In collaboration with Eat-n-Park, Starbucks, Dance Junction, and Ruby's Angels)
- Drive-Thru Winter Wonderland December 2020 (In collaboration with Ruby's Angels we collected a variety of presents to give to underprivileged children of the community)
- Drive-Thru Spaghetti Dinner January 2021 (Generous food donations from some congregation members and local businesses – We raised \$1400, all of which was given to the Shaler Schools Backpack Initiative and Bread of Life Food Pantry in Etna).
- Drive-Thru Easter Bunny Breakfast April 2021
- Community Play Day June 2021 We were able to show off our new Bounce Houses to the kids of the community. We estimate 50 kids in attendance!

For this next Fiscal Year, the Outreach Team has set for themselves three primary goals:

- 1. To encourage more church members to invest in the Outreach Team recruit new members. (If you are interested, talk to Jeff, Emma, or Laura!)
- 2. To maximize the church's online presence work with Tech Team to improve our website, worship broadcasts, and social media presence.
- 3. To promote an "Invitation Mindset" to make it easier for the congregation to invite friends and neighbors, and to motivate us all to do so!

Early Elementary Class (Ages 3-6)

Primary Class (Ages 7-11)

Teen Class (Ages 12-18)

I took the lead in teaching the Teen Sunday School class. We usually had two or three students. Some of the teens had jobs and often were scheduled to work on Sundays, which precluded them from attending. I do try to keep up with the teenagers on social media, since that's their main tool for communicating and interacting these days. This past year of COVID tended to disrupt their lives more than others', but thankfully, all of

the teens in this church have strong families who have been supportive and encouraging to them throughout the pandemic.

In the class, I focused on two primary goals: 1) really just connecting with the teens personally, getting to know them, and learning about their interests; and 2) weaving biblical teaching and principles into our conversations, trying to apply it to their real lives. Since I did youth ministry for many years, it was a blessing to continue to have this outlet for connecting with them. The teenagers are unique and inquisitive, and they are hungrier for spiritual nourishment than we often think. It's my prayer that in the future, we will once again be able to have a strong core of young people, and that we can justify bringing in another youth intern who can devote his/her time to encouraging and connecting with them.

When we finished the curriculum, we studied the Book of Daniel itself, reading a chapter a week, and we almost finished the book prior to adjourning for the summer.

Before the COVID pandemic, we had made progress in forming two small groups meeting in homes. While the pandemic put a hold on that, in the past few months, we have revitalized an in-depth study of the book of Romans. We meet in the Fellowship Hall, and our study will finish up at the end of July. We've had an average of 10-15 adults in attendance, with a couple kids enjoying fellowship together as well!

During the school year, we had a Young Adult Fellowship that met once a month for dinner, conversation, and study. We had anywhere from 15-20 young adults in

attendance, and we also provided childcare thanks to some of our teens. We hope to get that group up and running again this Fall.

I know that things are in the works to start one small group beginning this Fall, and I support that 100%! We are open to launching other groups based on interest or a specific topic! Just let me know and I'll do whatever I can to help get it off the ground.

^{*} During FY 2021, the Church sold the playground property. Half of the proceeds was invested, and the other half has been set aside for Ministry Investments. Of the \$15,139, approximately \$6,200 has been spent during the year for the bounce houses, additional bandwidth for streaming services, and the control booth move. Without the income from the sale of the property, the Church finished the year with a net deficit of \$514.72 which was achieved by cutting back on spending.
